Moe Goldman (1895-1976) was born in Augusta, Georgia, to Louis Goldman and Pauline Silver Goldman. His father was an immigrant from Manheim, Germany, and his mother was a native of Augusta, Georgia.

Moe Goldman attended Butler University in Indianapolis, Indiana, and served in the Army of Occupation in Europe at the end of World War I. He returned to take a traveling sales position for a shoe company. He moved to Atlanta, Georgia, in 1920 and met and courted Marie Rosenbaum (1901-1992) the daughter of Ralph Rosenbaum (1865-1960) and Harriett Kleinert Rosenbaum (1874-1948). Mr. Goldman and Ms. Rosenbaum were married on March 6,

Moe Goldman entered the real estate business and became Vice President of J. H. Ewing & Sons Real Estate. He was a member of The Atlanta Board of Realtors, a Shriner and member of the Scottish Rite, the Commerce Club and B'nai B'rith. He was a trustee of the Humantics Foundation, DeKalb County Chairman, Regional Six vice-president and treasurer of the Atlanta Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America. He received an honorary doctorate degree from High Point College, North Carolina, for the work he did in promoting youth programs. The year-round Boy Scout lodge at Camp Woodward near Blairsville, Georgia, has been dedicated to Mr. & Mrs. Moe Goldman for their generosity and work they have put forth on behalf of the Boy Scouts of America.

The collection will afford the researcher an insight into the lives of three families (Edison, Goldman, and Rosenbaum) during the years 1865 through It includes awards, a bible, condolence messages, correspondence, diaries, estate distribution, family tree, telegrams, and wedding gift list. There is also available a picture album and 90th birthday celebration album, along with several large certificates of awards and achievements.

In summation the collection will show that starting out as a traveling shoe salesman after returning from the Army of World War I, by spending a great amount of time and effort in community organizations, and making the most of personal contacts in a business way, a man elevated himself to a very successful financial position and received many awards.
